Commemorative Pavilion

Honoring the memory of lost comrades is an important part of the healing for many military service members. Intentionally located in a secluded spot overlooking the site, the pavilion offers a place for quiet reflection. The sound of flowing water from a stone fountain contributes to the tranquility of the space.

Communal Pavilion

Military culture is intrinsically communal, and this structure sits at the heart of the Green Road. Designed for small, informal gatherings, the pavilion contains a table and benches made from parts of the US Diamond Head, a World War II Victory ship launched in 1945.

Stony Creek

This is the central feature of the Green Road. Visitors are invited to explore paths to the stream. One of these leads to an accessible pebbled beach where stream life abounds.

Council Ring

This arrangement of stones is an organically designed gathering area adjacent to a favored environment for native deer. The Green Road's council ring offers a place for connecting with family and sharing stories of valor and loss with fellow service members.

TKF Benches & Journals

Our lead funder, the TKF foundation, provides special benches for each sacred green space it supports. The benches are an invitation to pause on one's journey—to rest, breathe, and be present. Made from reclaimed pickle barrel wood, each bench contains a pen and waterproof blank journal where visitors may share their thoughts.
