

Post-stroke rehabilitation research study



The Clinical Center of the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Maryland, is conducting a study for individuals who had a stroke at least three months ago. Following a stroke, many people participate in physical rehabilitation training, but the optimum schedule for rehabilitation has not been extensively studied. The purpose of this study is to find out how we can improve rehabilitation training. The results of this study may provide information that will help determine effective training schedules for rehabilitation.

You may qualify if you:

- Are 18-80 years old
- Had a stroke at least 3 months ago

You may not qualify if you:

- Have a history of alcohol or drug abuse
- Have a psychiatric illness such as severe depression
- Are unable to undergo a brain MRI
- Have a serious medical condition such as cancer



The study involves:

- Three to 10 outpatient experimental visits to the NIH Clinical Center, each lasting from one to several hours
- Complete physical examination
- Study-related tests



All study-related tests are provided at no cost. Participants will be compensated.
