



Unresectable Fibrolamellar Hepatocellular Carcinoma

Researchers at the National Institutes of Health are studying the use of an antibiotic called vancomycin treatment for unresectable Fibrolamellar Hepatocellular Carcinoma (FLC). FLC most often occurs in young people who have no history of liver disease. Researchers think gut bacteria may affect liver cancer, this antibiotic will help alter the gut bacteria and may be beneficial for this type of cancer.

Study Design

- ❖ Medical history and physical exam
- ❖ Take vancomycin 3 times a day
- ❖ Keep a medication diary
- ❖ Have a liver biopsy before treatment
- ❖ Follow up visit a month after treatment
