<u>National Center on Elder Abuse</u> – Administration on Aging, DHHS website with a compendium of fact sheets, publications, training materials and <u>state specific listings</u> of help lines, hotlines, state laws, state specific data and other resources.

<u>Eldercare Locator</u> – federal site helps identify services for older or vulnerable adults and their families, searchable by zip code or city/state.

<u>US Department of Justice Office for Victims of Crime</u> – federal site focused on addressing elder fraud and abuse, site also offers publications, resources, and training and technical assistance related to elder fraud and abuse.

<u>Elder Justice Initiative</u> – US Department of Justice is committed to fighting for justice for older Americans.

<u>Center of Excellence on Elder Abuse & Neglect</u> – Administration on Aging funded clearinghouse on information related to elder abuse, neglect, and exploitation.

<u>National Institute on Aging</u> – NIH Institute with information and resources for identifying and preventing elder abuse.

<u>Justice in Aging</u> – focused on protecting the rights of low-income older adults through advocacy and education.

<u>Maryland Department Human Services Adult Protective Services</u> – state agency that oversees adult protective services, contains legal definitions, reporting instructions, <u>project SAFE</u> (stop adult financial exploitation) and a statewide listing of adult protective service <u>hotlines by county</u>.

<u>Maryland Department of Aging</u> – information and resources to identify services and programs for vulnerable and older adults.

<u>DC Adult Protective Services</u> – Provides information, resources, and investigates reports of suspected abuse, neglect, and exploitation of vulnerable adults.

DC Department of Aging and Community Living – locate resources and services for older adults.
